This is the initial course for anyone interested in becoming a Teaching Assistant or looking to work in schools. You may already be supporting children and young people in a school environment, but you do not have to be employed or volunteering for this knowledge-based qualification.

This qualification builds on your knowledge from the introductory course and allows you to focus your time on improving the skills you need to progress to the full Level 2 certificate.

Assessment method

This is an accredited course and as such you will receive

- verbal and written feedback from your tutor for classroom activities, course work and home study assignments
- Full completion of your portfolio will also be assessed by your tutor/assessor and then submitted to the awarding body for certification.

Entry requirements

You will have successfully completed the Introduction to Teaching Assistant, Health & Social Care or Child care and have been progressed to Level 1 by your tutor.
