Course overview

You can improve your speaking and listening, reading and writing skills, whilst working towards your own goals and a functional skills qualification at Entry 3.

What will I study?

On this course you will learn how to:

- Read and recognise different sorts of text
- Spell a range of familiar and unfamiliar words
- Use capital letters, full stops, question marks (?) and exclamation marks (!)
- Write short and compound sentences
- Write in paragraphs - Write letters, short reports and stories
- Plan, draft and proof-read your writing
- Take part in discussions

Assessment method

Various assessment methods, including on-line and paper-based assessments, individual, group work and communication activities, and given feedback on your progress. Throughout the course you will also receive feedback from your tutor and learn the skills to self-reflect and evaluate your progress.

Entry requirements

You will need to complete an English access course or introduction course prior to enrolling on this course to ensure this course is at a suitable level for your needs.

What should I bring with me?

You will need to take notes so bring along your preferred tools such as pen/paper or electronic device. An A4 ringbinder folder will also be essential.
