

CPD: Using Play to Learn and Teach

Course overview

Play is a great way to connect with a child and develop trust and communication. It can also be a method of teaching and learning. Play can enhance social, emotional, intellectual and physical development. In this workshop we will take a look at different examples of play activities and how they can support learning in literacy, mathematics, art and expression as well as support social, emotional, intellectual and physical development.

This short course is ideal for new parents, parents struggling to know how to support their child's learning at home, learners on Health and Social Care and Teaching Assistant courses as well as people working in those professions.

What will I study?

You will:

- Explore and discuss different play activities and their appropriate age groups
- Discuss why play is important
- Be able to identify the different learning outcomes that can be achieved with play activities
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Assessment method

- You will participate in discussions, Q&A and activities and receive verbal feedback from the tutor throughout the session.
