

Multiply Courses (95XXN) and (95XXD) (95XXM)

Course overview

Developing numeracy skills such as reading and writing numbers, recognising date and time, and understanding transactions with money are important for everyday life, studying and working. These courses will give you the opportunity to develop your numeracy skills as well as your English language using everyday topics involving numbers.

What will I study?

Our first steps courses: 'Reading and writing numbers' and 'Working with Date and Time' will give you the opportunity to start developing your numerical vocabulary, learn about writing numbers, and improve your confidence when reading dates and times.

Our 'Money Wise' courses will help you to explore various budgeting and purchasing strategies, and discuss ways you might spend and save money. You will get to meet new people, explore new topics, and improve your speaking and listening skills whilst acquiring and developing your numeracy skills.

Assessment method

- Tutor observation
- Question and answer
- Self assessment
- Paired, group, individual, and on-line tasks

Entry requirements

You will need to complete an initial assessment prior to joining the course and to meet the government resident eligibility criteria. Please bring ID with you when you enroll.

What should I bring with me?

You will need to bring a pen, paper, or any other note-taking device for these sessions. You are advised, and will be supported, to install our learning platform Teams on your phone or any other electronic device. You will be able to access all the course resources and communicate with your teacher via Teams.
